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AYURVEDA VIEW ON VAMANA KARMA AND ROLE OF VAMAKA DRAVAYA IN THE THERAPEUTIC ACTION OF VAMANA

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Abstract

Panchakarma represents a distinctive facet of Ayurveda, it consists five internal purification procedures to detoxify body. Among these, Vamana Karma stands as the inaugural step, predominantly recommended for addressing Kaphaja disorders. The ancient *Charaka Samhita* mentioned various aspects on Vamana Dravyas and their corresponding Kalpa. These Vamaka Dravyas possess qualities such as Ushna, Tikshna, Sukshma, Vyavayi and Vikasi Guna. These properties allow Vamaka Dravyas to be absorbed and reach at the site of action quickly and effectively. Vamanopaga Dravyas exhibit characteristics like Madhura Rasa, Sheeta Virya and Madhura Vipaka, by virtue of these properties Vamaka Dravyas exerts their action of therapeutic detoxification. These properties also serve to mitigate the irritative nature of Vamana Dravyas. This article represents Ayurveda view on Vamana Karma and Role of Vamaka Dravaya in the therapeutic action of Vamana.

DR. SWATI AMBADAS THAKARE ET AL AYURVEDA VIEW ON *VAMANA KARMA* AND ROLE OF *VAMAKA DRAVAYA* IN THE THERAPEUTIC ACTION OF *VAMANA*

Introduction

Vamana is a therapeutic process designed to expel imbalanced *Doshas* through the upper route. *Vamana's* primary objective is to eliminate excess *Kapha* that has accumulated in the upper gastrointestinal tract. *Vamaka Dravyas* are used as medicinal substances to induce therapeutic vomiting. These *Vamaka Dravyas* possess warm, sharp, subtle, penetrating and expansive qualities. These properties along with the potency of *Vamaka Dravyas* help them to exert their biological action. The sweet taste, cooling potency and sweet post-digestive effect also contributed towards the biological action and patient compliance of *Vamana Dravyas*.

Vamaka Dravyas play a pivotal role in guiding the aberrant *Doshas* towards the *Kostha*. Their *Urdhavabhagha* influence leads these substances to redirect the morbid *Doshas* towards the mouth, subsequently facilitating their expulsion through the emesis process. These *Vamaka Dravyas* are absorbed into the bloodstream and possess the ability to traverse the blood-brain barrier. Their qualities and *Urdhavabhagha* actions, collectively contribute to this emetic effect.

These substances reach to the *Hridaya* due to their unique *Prabhava* and *Virya*. They then circulate through the micro-channels, aided by their *Sukshma* and *Vyavayi* actions. This circulation results in the dispersion and breaking down of morbid *Doshas* and accumulated toxins. The *Tikshana* quality of *Dravyas* plays a crucial role in this process. Ultimately, the expelled toxins include aggravated *Kapha* and *Pitta Doshas*, along with other harmful substances which further removed from the body.

Classification

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


Figure 1: Types of Vamana depending on the choice of drugs

Acharya Charaka has classified the *Vamana* procedure into two categories: *Sadhyo Vamana* and *Sneha Purvaka Vamana*. Similarly, *Vamana* is further categorized as depicted in Figure 1, depending on the choice of drugs.

Furthermore, classification of Vamana Dravyas based on following aspects:

- 4 Pratyaksha and Apratyaksha Vamaka Dravyas.
- Emetic drugs that either act centrally or locally within the body.
- **4** Differentiation into *Ruksha* and *Snigdha* substances.

Within the principles of *Vamana Kalpa*, various edible substances enriched with *Vartikriya*, linctuses, extracts, gruels, soups and *Kambalika* are administered to patients in need of *Vamana* therapy. Ayurveda also categorizes *Vamana* drugs into two distinct types; *Vamaka* drugs and *Vamanopaga* drugs. *Vamaka* drugs have the specific property of inducing vomiting in the patient. These drugs are characterized by their warm and sharp nature, and they have a systemic effect throughout the body. Examples of *Vamaka* drugs include Liquorice and *Vacha*. *Vamanopaga* drugs belong to the category of spices and include substances like *Madana Phal*, *Amalaki* and *Pippali*, etc.

Role of Vamana Dravyas:

Vamana Dravyas possesses properties such as *Vyavayi* and *Vikasi*, allowing them to swiftly penetrate the body's micro-vessels by virtue of their potency. These drugs cause the accumulated *Doshas* to get liquefy and fragment into smaller particles due to their *Ushna* and

Tikshna qualities. The *Vikasi Guna* aids in eliminating impurities from the body's tissues, while the *Sukshma Guna* facilitates the transportation of *Vamana* drugs. Ultimately, *Kapha*, in a liquefied state, is expelled through the stomach and respiratory tract.

Vamana Karma represents an intensive therapeutic approach aimed at eradicating the underlying *Kapha* pathology, typically found in its primary site of accumulation. This procedure effectively purges various forms of harmful substances from the body. The preparatory measures of *Vamana Karma* contribute to the smoother mobilization of *Doshas* from the peripheral branches to the *Koshta*.

Vamana therapy is typically initiated during the early morning, a time considered to be most conducive for addressing Kapha imbalances. Medicines including *Madanaphalapippali, Saindhava Lavana, Vacha* and others are employed for this purpose. These Vamana drugs permeate throughout the body's channels, leading to the breakdown of toxins. Toxins are purged from the *Amashaya* and the respiratory passages. It is in these regions that vitiated *Kapha* primarily accumulates, and *Vamana* therapy plays a pivotal role in alleviating morbidity from these areas, offering therapeutic benefits for conditions associated with *Kapha* imbalances.

The qualities of *Vamaka Dravya* have the capacity to transform stubborn and hardened toxins, bringing them to the *Amashaya*. Medicines facilitate the transport of morbid materials from the *Amashaya* to the upper channels. Ultimately, toxins and aggravated *Doshas* are expelled through the mouth during the emesis process as part of the therapy. The *Urdhwabhagahara* action of *Vamaka Dravyas* plays a crucial role in the physiological action of *Vamana* therapy. *Ushna Guna* generates *Pachana* and *Dahana* effects. When *Vamana Dravyas* is administered with *Lavana*, they spread at the cellular level, leading to the production of *Vishyandana*. *Tikshna Guna* imparts rapid action, facilitating the *Chhedana* and *Sravana* of *Doshas* at their respective sites. *Sukshma Guna* aids in the transportation of *Vamana* drugs through the *Srotasas*. When these drugs reach their target due to their subtle nature, they induce *Pachana* and *Vishyandana* of *Doshas*, making it easier for morbid *Doshas* to be eliminated from the body. *Vikasi Guna* of *Vamaka Dravyas* supports

the transportation of drugs to the levels of *Dhatus*. This results in the softening and weakening of *Doshas* residing in the *Dhatus*, preparing them for elimination *via* the *Koshtha*. The *Urdhwabhagaharaprabhava* property of *Vamaka Dravyas* induces emesis, directing *Doshas* towards the *Koshtha*, from where they are expelled through the oral route. Ultimately, *Vamana Karma* brings *Kapha* and *Pitta Doshas* to the *Koshtha*, from where these *Doshas* are eliminated. This therapy also relocates morbid *Doshas* from the *Koshtha* to the mouth, where the emetic effect facilitates their removal. As a result, *Vamana Karma* is particularly beneficial for conditions associated with *Kapha* and *Pitta* imbalances.

Conclusion:

The commonly employed *Vamana* and *Vamanopaga* drugs are *Aragwadha*, *Dhamargava*, *Madanaphala*, *Kutaja*, *Madhu*, *Nimba*, *Patola*, *Madhuka*, *Vacha* and *Pippali*, etc. The selection of appropriate classical *Vamana Dravyas* is contingent upon factors such as the patient's medical condition, disease severity and the desired level of therapeutic efficacy, etc. These *Vamaka Dravyas* offers *Sukshma*, *Ushna*, *Tikshna*, *Vyavayi* and *Vikasi Guna*. These qualities help *Vamaka Dravyas* to absorb and reach at the site of action. *Vamanopaga Dravyas* also exhibit qualities like *Sheeta Virya*, *Madhura Vipaka* and *Madhura Rasa*. These properties of *Vamaka Dravyas* contributed significantly towards the biological action of therapy. This therapy used to alleviate many health ailments mainly arising from *Kapha* imbalances.

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
